## Churchill, Manitoba and the dangers of privatization



Home to Canada's only arctic deepwater port, Churchill is a small northern community on the shore of Hudson Bay. Churchill is home to about 850 people. Due to its geography, the community is inaccessible by road and dependent on connections by rail, water, and air.

The geographic location of Churchill makes it an ideal spot for a northern port, since it provides access to the North Atlantic. Churchill used to be a major hub for grain shipping as well. The Port of Churchill once shipped thousands of kilos of grain all over the world.

The Port was conceived as "a great nation-building enterprise", a more direct route to Europe, and a strategic gateway for Canada's claim to the Arctic.

However, instead of investing in this community and strategic Arctic port, the Canadian government has failed this town, its citizens, and all of Canada by allowing private corporations to take over, with disastrous results.
